- We don't have to like the facts; we don't even have to believe facts, because we can test facts. If wrong they will be proven false.
- A fact is different from a truth; while truth is neither subjective nor personal; half-truths and misinformation abound and show a disgraceful contempt for thinking and the facts of the matter.
- Some; who pollute the language argue you can have your own truth based on your own beliefs; even delusional or exploitive beliefs.
- But facts are based upon empirical evidence which is a prerequisite for sustained true predictions of factual outcomes.

Forward

Demonstrations, sit-ins and protest marches are perhaps the most ineffective thing a person working for societal change can engage in. They are little more than organized temper tantrums. As a demonstration of resistance and a show of discontent they are futile.

- The Occupy movement,¹ Standing Rock,² the Sunrise movement³, all failed in their objectives.
- Me Too⁴ deserves special attention because it has women fighting men. Divide and conquer has reached its apogee when women advocate the end of due process for men. First they ended due process for men and I cheered.⁵
- Black Lives Matter would have been created by Trump to justify fascist policies if it did not exist already. Fighting for fairness, does not work.

Only the Red State teachers' strikes⁶ were effective in achieving their goals. They were part of a broader organized labour movement, and that perhaps is the most important lesson to be learned. If you struggle towards your own narrow interest; race, gender, your pride, you are part of the divided masses. If you struggle for your brothers and sisters, as the labour movement does, you will succeed.

Do not allow yourself to be condescended to with a label of activist; you're a citizen engaged in public service. If you are fighting for the down trodden; it is a high calling.

To see you fighting in isolation for your own grievance is the goal of the corporate class. They want to see you squabble like rats at the bottom of the barrel. The corporate media will advocate that you vote; but leave politics and debate to the political class. The eternal task is to be involved to ensure that the interests of the greater good are served. Individuals who profess to be career politicians need to be recycled regularly and prevented from being easily purchased lapdogs of the corporate class.⁷ The only thing that can stop the atrocity of the paid off politician and lobbyists working for themselves and not you is your involvement in political service as a citizen.

Political service is extremely important; roles exist for everyone and the roles go beyond standing with a protest sign shouting, or signing petitions.

Political

- running for office, or working for a constituency association,
- political organizing and campaigning, signing up members,
- volunteering on election day,

Organizational

- organizing boycotts against amoral corporations,
- organizing and supporting a political action committee,
- organizing and supporting cooperative businesses,

Economic

- Organize your workplace, unionize, and help the working poor.
- Make instead of buy; want less, especially TV and monitored media
- Study monetary policy and how tax laws concentration wealth,

Journalistic

- exposing unjust monopolies, unfair economic practices,
- creating and running Media,
- Writing polemics, strategy, songs, plays, children's stories.

Research

- Studying and educate about the tax and labour practices of corporate criminals,
- Studying and educate about Non-violent resistance techniques,
- Studying and understanding your representatives voting

Personal choices

- You have been duped into believing that voting and marching, or maybe your food group (vegan) or the car you drive (prius), or turning off lights and recycling are going to make a difference. It's not about how we work as individuals what matters its how we work in unison, There is strength in well thought out strategic action of large organized groups of people. The corporate media will tell you that strength comes from diversity. Note the consistency not the diversity of their message.

Collective action required strategy; it is hard, like the header says “Strategy requires non emotional thinking, it is about observing, preparing and the timing of action, and it is the science and work of ensuring your passion builds your vision.”

Despite the heavy corporate messaging to the contrary, being a vegan and driving a prius may make you feel smug and vindicated but it is not political service and we are not going to consume and drive ourselves out of the mess we have created.

If you want to be effective you will do exactly what the corporate media tell you is no longer in style, you will engage in labour education, worker organization and strike actions, but most important above all: resist. Submission is for the broken, the unthinking and the down trodden, being thoughtful, strategic and engaged is to be a citizen.

It can be argued that protests help galvanize people around important issues. Of course this is true, but the goal is not galvanized people. The goal is to effect meaningful change for a more just world. If you want to do next to nothing but still be effective just send money to the politician in your area, that is a language they understand, and maybe you can start a dialogue.

If you want to shape policy; you need to think strategically. What is needed is a Multi-pronged approach that includes systematic efforts to monitor policy, contact policymakers, and for regular citizens to remain engaged in the political process in the long run. The effectiveness relies on challenging the political elites by informed motivated citizens.

On business I have travelled to China a dozen times or more, a Chinese friend of mine there laughed at me when I told him we were free in Canada but they were not free in China. He explained that in China they can protest, in Canada we can protest, in China if you take the protest sign and hit a police officer you are arrested. In Canada if you take the protest sign and hit an officer you are arrested. No difference. He explained it was not about protesting because protesting did nothing.

The difference between China and Canada was that China was an administrative state with the communist party as a head; we were an administrative state with the corporate party of one form or another at the head, no difference.

China has elections, Canada has elections, and he said the difference was in the police, in China it was harder to organize because the police monitored everything. He said in Canada you had your privacy if you choose to exercise that privacy. Then he added laughing (at me) for now.

Things that are better than protesting

Educate yourself: its better than protesting (BTP)

The problems you face on a daily basis are not because of another race, your gender, your unmet needs as a (insert identity), your unmet needs as a perpetually grieved (insert survivor label). It's not because of what your parents, school; a bully or ex lover did to you. It's not because you're a person of colour, faith, or a minority or the silent majority. Those are all things that the Corporate media talks about to distract you from the literal theft that is taking place from you as a citizen every day.

The issues that affect you and your happiness are somewhat complex. Things like

- tax, banking, employment and labour law,
- corporate personhood, corporate takeovers, trans national corporations,
- economic planning designed to concentration wealth,
- political corruption via the American Legislative Exchange Council (ALEC),
- municipal zoning, municipal planning and municipal funding,
- over population and post exponential growth population scenarios,
- the arms trade and the wars they facilitate and the moral poverty they represent,
- media ownership and the effect on democratic institutions,
- changes from print to digital media and the effect on our psyche,
- How “*monitored and manipulated anxiety disorder*” (Social media) is affecting the way we see the world and relate to others.

It's so much easier to think all your problems are because of your skin colour, sexual orientation or some other contrived distraction⁸. Many issues get attention and are cultivated not because of any moral or ethical value but because they are the most distant distraction from what matters to the rich who aggregate wealth the way the distracted collect friends on Facebook and wait anxiously by the phone hoping for stimulation like dopamine addicted keyboard monkeys.

When CNN covers it, you know it's not going to lead to any meaningful social change. Gil-Scott said in the 60's in regards to the Black Panther Party “*the revolution will not be televised*”. What Gil-Scott was trying to say in 1960, and what I am repeating here with the help of Tom Robinson because it is still relevant is the following;

- The “media” is a world created for the purpose of advertisements and neither an accurate mirror of reality nor a true measure of human potential.
- The world needs active participants in change rather than a passive audience.
- It is a call to get up off the couch and take your rights; stop waiting for freedom.
- The poem accomplishes all of this by using the language of consumerism and slogans from television ads to tell us what the revolution will not look like.⁹

A beat poem from the 1960's with Black Panther references may be a bit obscure for post 2020 people to appreciate. So I will try to explain with a reference from the 1950's

Marshall McLuhan said the medium is the message. Electric media, as he called it was different; it is extremely sophisticated in how it shapes our opinions. Having given up privacy, allowing "feeds", we allow the crafting of our thinking. The message of today's medium is we gave up independent thinking.

That phenomenon makes Gill's poem relevant today. You are not going to find solutions on corporate media; **the revolution will not be televised**. The owners of media work for those who want inequity, war and injustice. They will not provide a road map to end the system that makes them who they are.

Tune in, Turn on and get alternative forms of expression. **The revolution will not be televised**, by Google, Facebook, Twitter or the app of today.

Understand and keep the Internet free; its BTP

The internet is an amazing tool, start by learning how it is used by the Corporate State. Simply put Facebook, Twitter, Google, Amazon are all in positions of power because they funnel data commercially to the highest bidder. Under court order they give it to the corporate state. The structure of data communications is such that the path of data is not the fastest route, but the cheapest route. The state owns and supports the cheapest routes so they see everything. If you want your political organization to be subverted by the corporate state, talk about it on Facebook, Twitter, Google or buy on Amazon. Forget about Virtual Private Networks (VPN) they all have back doors for monitoring,¹⁰ forget about commercial encryption, do you know who sold it to you?

What all the "social" media companies do is create a psychological profile of you; this profile is predictive to the point that they know where you will be tomorrow at 3:00 even if you don't.

Understand and act upon Behavior, its BTP

Behavior is a Google company. They track your location 24 hours a day, to predict where you will be and what you will do there; hours, days, or even weeks into the future. They¹² do this by

studying a special cohort of over 10,000 people on whom they have a “360 degree view” using their accumulated Meta data they develop predictive algorithms. This 360 degree view is what Google creates on every citizen by studying what they do on line. By applying lessons learned by this large cohort of individuals matched to existing behaviors they can with a high degree of accuracy predict behaviors in similar profile people in the general population on whom they have a 360 degree view.

Everything you do on Google, every comment on Facebook, every tweet, every purchase on Amazon adds to your profile.. By correlating actual data, your searches, likes, your tweets with theoretical and experimental data they have derived a predictive science.

This ability to predict your actions and opinions goes beyond what you will buy next, to the point where it is understood the information you need to form an opinion one way or another on a specific issue. Trying to decide on X or Y, well a person of your profile responds to idea A, not idea B or picture C, so you will only see A and they can measure if your opinion has been changed by what you do next. Make no mistake; they know what you will do next.

This is why privacy matters. This is why Facebook, Google and Twitter are so happy to offer you a service for “free”.

Add to this, there are the apps, some obvious, some embedded in website and software. Many of these applications are fronts for data aggregators, groups of apps that pull pieces of data about you from every direction. Each addition to your profile will enhance the ability to piece together your identity so that your identity can be stolen. The effects of identity theft are serious and can be financially and emotionally devastating. The stolen data is used:

- To commit tax fraud.
- To gain access to your social media
- To fraudulently obtain a loan in your name
- To steal your home through mortgage fraud
- To the extortion of your business
- To make your life a miserable hell, and waste hundreds of hours of your time

It can cost hundreds of hours and thousands of dollars to repair and it is difficult and nearly impossible to determine who is responsible.

The phenomena of the manipulation of your thoughts and the theft of your identity starts with the incredibly naive notion “oh I am not concerned I have nothing to hide”. Stupidity on this level is difficult to counter as it requires a level of media literacy that should have been taught in schools in grades 3 thru 12. It will be interesting to see how the Chan- Zuckerberg “New Literacy Foundation” attempts to improve our media literacy. And yes I was being incredibly sarcastic with that comment.

Understand and act on the Sequence Read Archive: BTP

Having learned everything about us; our desires and our behavior, knowing where we are and what we will do, Google has moved inside to our DNA.

Google's recently took over key search and storage operations for the Sequence Read Archive¹³, a massive public repository of DNA data, as well as its funding of at least two Silicon Valley companies that provide DNA mapping services for consumers. When DNA profiles become part of people's dossiers, Google will know far more about people than they know themselves – what diseases people are likely to get (think of the marketing opportunities), what their racial origins are, and the possibilities are endlessly outrageous.

Getting Woke: its BTP

All of Google / Every App / all Social Media's income are based upon knowing the target: you. You agreed to it when you starting using it, you know the Terms of Service agreement. So the first thing to do is get Woke about what's happening with your data.

Drop Google, Drop Facebook, and Drop any media that delivers anything to your inbox, then start reading offline. News papers are gone, but books are out there. The great thing about a paper book is your profile does not know what you read, unless you order it on Amazon. Its does not prepare you for the targeted ads and you get a broader range of ideas when you exit your "bubble" or more accurately the "intellectual prison" that you feel so comfortable in.

Now you can be active and effective, imagine if the Allies tried to win a war while every move they made was monitored by the Nazis. Not Woke!

"Social media" makes it easy to express yourself, that expression is monitored and analyzed by sophisticated algorithms that categorize you and deliver you to advertisers whose goal it is to manipulate you into buying things or ideas. Nothing just occurs to you.

Facebook started in 2004; so the first wave of students who spent all their teen years being profiled started voting in 2016. The presidency of Donald Trump began January 20, 2017. Monitoring and manipulation of media is the Donald's thing.

These first "social-media natives" will be different from previous generations in that their sexual, political, familial, likes, their economic, intellectual and moral potential will be understood by the corporate class. What good will come of this information and power?

A whole generation engaged on command. The balance of power is now in a mob being monitored and manipulated for profit and Google has learned how to control the levers.

Reflect on Gandhi also BTP: This is how a citizen behaves

Gandhi created modern India. Today steady streams of people walk continuously past his tomb in Delhi to show their respect for what he accomplished.

The lives-and deaths-of Chief Lithuli¹⁴ and Dr. Martin Luther King¹⁵ have proved that there is nothing esoteric about nonviolence, limiting it to a particular country or a particular period. Gandhi's had total allegiance to nonviolence; there were few who were prepared to follow his doctrine of nonviolence to its logical conclusion : the adoption of unilateral disarmament in a world armed to the teeth, the scrapping of the police and the armed forces, and the decentralization of administration to the point where the state would "wither away".

Gandhi showed that all the forces of the modern State, arms, money, a controlled press, are nothing when faced with conviction of right and truth. He was prepared to die for his convictions rather than submit to force. Like Lithuli and King he did. Nonviolent resistance demands courage of a high order, the courage to resist injustice without rancour, to unite the utmost firmness with the utmost gentleness, to invite suffering but not to inflict it, to die but not to kill.¹⁶ It is not a tactic of protest, it is not a lifestyle.

As early as 1924, he had declared that "the better mind of the world desires today, not absolutely independent states, warring one against another, but a federation of independent, of friendly interdependent states." Even before the First World War had revealed the disastrous results of the combination of industrialism and nationalism, he had become a convert to the idea that violence must be completely abjured.

Gandhi had ideas that applied to rural India a hundred years ago; a literal application of his ideas is not the point. An appreciation for local culture, local economic development, education, and non violence is the point. The solutions of today will not be a spinning wheel and loin cloth, but it will be local and its implementation will mimic the strategies articulated by Gandhi. Read and learn how Martin Luther King Jr used Non Violence as a principle to develop Kingian Nonviolence. Cultural appropriation is always a good thing.

The philosophy of Kingian Nonviolence ¹⁷

Developed by Dr. King and explained in his book, "Stride Toward Freedom", chapter VI, Pilgrimage to Nonviolence.

He explains in detail the Six Principles of Kingian Nonviolence: Kingian non violence as used by police forces around the world is an example of practical applications of the principles of non violence in modern life.

"The philosophy and the strategy of Kingian Nonviolence could be an effective skill in policing. I began experimenting with the philosophy in conflicts I encountered in my everyday duties as a police officer. I started with the interpersonal conflicts officers have with each other and supervisors. I was impressed with Dr. King's understanding of nonviolence resistance, where he continues to examine himself as to what part he played in the conflict. My intellectual understanding of the philosophy was being applied to real personal conflicts, the more I used the philosophy and continued my readings of Dr. King's writings, the clearer the philosophy became. Through my application of nonviolence, I was convinced that it is possible "to win your opponent over", and not "to win over your opponent," which is the goal of Kingian Nonviolence".

Principle 1: Nonviolence is a Way of Life for Courageous People

Principle 2: The Beloved Community is the Goal

Principle 3: Attack Forces of Evil, Not Persons Doing Evil

Principle 5: Avoid Internal Violence of the Spirit as well as External Physical Violence

8. Turn off tracking search engines and go with duckduckgo.com or the like
9. Strive to turn off Google, Facebook, Microsoft and Amazon; they sold their soul; and they want yours.
10. Turn off media that limits you to seconds or characters, it's a profile builder.

Drop out:

11. Learn how to grow you own food or buy it from an individual who has figured it out. There are thousands of independent farms to help you be independent.
12. Change never starts from the inside, Lead a small group, some may follow.
13. Make stuff, a quilt, a card, an NSA computer hack, whatever makes you happy!
14. Do the unpredictable, shock the Google algorithm, for a week buy nothing with a bar code, use your imagination, free yourself.

Be a Citizen, forget about click activism; it's all just a survey to pigeon hole you.

15. Join a political party. Big or small, which one? Not the point. Don't waste your time calling your representative; but donate to them and they will call you.
16. Run in the next election. It's worth the effort and something you should do once in your life. You'll discover a bit more about how the world works.
17. Start an organization and network with other organizations. You are more effective if you have a lobby group behind you. Even if it is only 2 or 3 people.
18. Learn how to think, ¹⁹ you need it for #19.
19. Learn how to write, you need it for #20.
20. Create your own Media. Photocopy, publish a quarterly newsletter, create a website, find an old Gestetner²⁰ printer, become an expert, talk to your neighbors in a "salon"²¹, put on a workshop, be active. Be the crank with a factual rant.
21. Turn off your TV and unsubscribe from newsfeeds.
22. Come to terms that there is no middle class anymore, only deck hands and those who have 300 foot yachts. Time to stop being a deck hand and organize.
23. Start a union where you work. Its fun, you'll raise a stink; probably loose your job but robots are going to take it anyway, its better to resist than submit.
24. Spread Love; turn your back on hate.

¹ The Occupy movement opposed inequality and the lack of democracy in America. The movement embraced a diversity of ideas so it lacked focus. It did have a prime concern of large corporations and the strangle hold they maintain thru the global financial system that disproportionately benefits the ruling class. Sadly they were distracted with a laundry list of social issues that were tangential to, or an outcome of the fundamental message. This distraction from the core issue happens when there is no clear leadership or vision, where diversity of opinion is seen as strength. It has been demonstrated countless times that diversity is not strength.

² Standing Rock Reservation is in North and South Dakota. It is a 9,000 square kilometers reservation with a population of 8,000. The residents live in poverty. Historically the Plains Indians were nomadic, as the worlds population increased conflicts began and they, like all nomadic people had to settle into farming.

The Dakota Access Pipeline is a threat to water supplies. In 2016 a camp was established to protest the pipeline. Protests drew people from throughout North America. Arrests occurred when people locked themselves to heavy machinery. Facebook assisted in identifying and censoring the protesters.

A federal judge denied an injunction sought by the tribe; Under Obama the Department of the Interior, Justice, and Army halted construction of the pipeline around the Lake but not halting the project.
